Ctrl+. or x .	Nukta, e.g. k Ctrl+. > क̣ g Ctrl+. > ग̣ j Ctrl+. > ज̣

K	ख̣ (precomposed single character U+0A59)
G	ग̣ (precomposed single character U+0A5A)
z	ज̣ (precomposed single character U+0A5B)

Special keys

Key(s)	Utility
X	This key performs several crucial functions. It is used to <ol style="list-style-type: none">prevent merger of contiguous characters e.g. k x i gives क्खि while k i gives कि ; k x h gives क्खह while k h gives क्खtype certain nasal consonants e.g. x m gives ङ्ख and x n gives ण्ख
/	This key is used for typing conjoined consonants or <i>yuktavarnas</i> and <i>matras</i> .Just type in the constituent consonants and then press / to get the conjoined form, or a full vowel followed by / to get the corresponding vowel sign or <i>matra</i> . e.g. t r / gives त्र; t y gives त्रय; i / > ि
Ctrl+ /	This key combination does the opposite of joining, i.e. it splits up joined consonants, changes <i>matras</i> to full vowels e.g. त्र Ctrl+ / gives त्र, ि Ctrl+ / gives ि
